Discussion

The modern police state is the metastasis of the lamplighters and night watchmen who patrolled colonial villages after dark so the hardworking villagers could sleep.

In 2000-2010, the Chicago Police Department employed approx. 600% more officers and staff per inhabitant than in any decade prior to 1970 in Chicago history.

The city outsources policing to private contractors and these outsourced police, in combination with private security hired by private entities provide another 600±% police per inhabitant than in decades before 1970.

One of the 600-1200% excess police should be able to troll along D Street at intervals sufficient to notice, nab, and deter the #29 owner, his tenants and guests who habitually drink at #24 and other white owned/occupied properties on the block.
